By a pillar of fire you led us through the desert to a land flowing with milk and honey, and set before us the way for life. You spoke of love and justice in the prophets, and in the Word made flesh you lived among us, manifesting your glory. He died that we might live, and is risen to raise us to new life.**

O, Holy God of majesty, blessed is Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord, whom you sent to save us. He came with healing in his touch and was wounded for our sins. He came with mercy on his lips and was mocked as one despised. He came with peace in his heart and met with violence and death.

Remembering all your mighty and merciful acts, O God, we take this bread and this wine from the gifts given to us and we celebrate with joy the redemption won for us in Jesus Christ. Accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving as a living and holy offering of ourselves, that our lives may proclaim the One crucified and risen.

And Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these your gifts of bread and wine, that the bread we break and the cup we share may be the communion of the body and blood of Christ. By your Holy Spirit make us one with Christ and one with all who share this feast, united in ministry in every place. As this bread is Christ's body for us, send us out to the body of Christ in the world. Amen.
