THE PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

L: The Lord be with you.

P: **And also with you.**

L: Lift up your hearts.

P: **We lift them up to the Lord.**

L: We give thanks to the Lord.

P: **It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

L: Eternal God, creator and ruler of the universe, at your word the earth was made and spun on its course among the planets. Your hand formed us from the dust of the earth and set us among all your creatures to love and serve you.
