ANNOUNCEMENTS

<u>DEVOTION FOR THE WEEK:</u> Transitions are not easy. We learn to deal with change, and listen for the leading of God through change and to bring change, Elisha's distress at the prospect of losing his mentor, Elijah, emphasizes his sense that he is not yet ready—fully ready—for the mantle of his mentor. In the wisdom of the psalmist there is a recognition that reflecting on where God's leading has been seen previously can guide into future change. The challenge of living in the freedom of the Spirit is a very subtle balance of walking in deep awareness of how freedom is exercised each day and with each breath. The gospel highlights the difficulties of following even the wisest of mentors; it is not a task to be taken lightly. *Scriptures: 2 Kings 2:1-2, 6-14, Psalm 77:1-2, 11-20, Luke 9:51-62; Galatians 5:1, 13-25*
