CALL TO CONFESSION

God's love is so amazing that while we were separated from the Lord, God reached out in compassion and mercy to heal us. Therefore, we are free to confess our need of God's grace.

CONFESSION BILL CARTER

In you, God, we have felt safe and secure for generations. We have known how to live and how to behave. We have been certain of what we have had to offer. Yet, every now and then we have felt there was more. We have been aware that not everything we have done has lifted people's burdens.

In our own lives we have sometimes felt our hearts go cold and our attitudes harden, especially towards those who we think are using us for their own purposes, or not trying to change what they can to address their situations. We have sometimes felt the heaviness of burdens for the future of the church.

We have sometimes been acutely aware that some people are pushed to the edges, that expectations are too hard, and we have longed to find ways to heal wounds and lift burdens; but we have been weighed down by our own sense of inadequacy, or afraid to step past the edges of what is known and acceptable. So, God, in the words of another's prayer, "grant us the serenity to accept the things we cannot change, the courage to change the things we can, and the wisdom to know the difference" until the drip, drip, drip has reached the point of pressure that cracks the heart of stone, shifts the edges of the world in view, and connects us with another possibility of life and hope and love and healing.
