Sometimes we are the ones who feel ourselves to be unworthy of God's grace and generosity, and we bow our heads in humility. And at other times, we confess, we feel full of righteousness, boasting of the goodness we share and do. We are so glad not to be like others, whom we might believe clearly need your forgiveness. We neglect to notice ways wealth and privilege may have created need and brokenness. Yet when we arrive at this place, we, too, need your forgiveness and compassion, Loving One, for in our self-righteousness we arrive at another kind of sin. We may not have cheated, or stolen, or abused another directly, but our contentment and pride of achievement can alienate us from our deepest connection to you, and from seeing how it has been part of another's suffering. At times, life seems a dance of not-enough and too much; we confess we don't always know where to land. Can we lead, even in our poverty? Can we follow, even in our wealth and abundance? Show us the balance that holds humility and generosity together in one stance. Lead us in a dance of true union and grace, forgive us our sinfulness - whatever form it may take - and dance with us in new life again, we pray.
