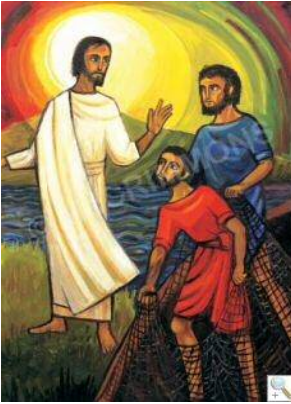

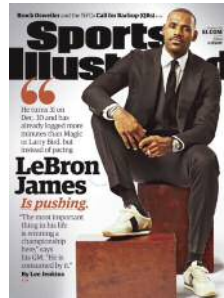
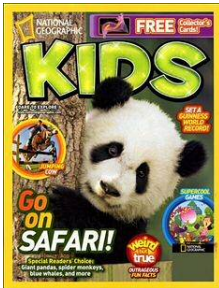


Monthly Mission for February 2019
