Roderic P. (Rod) Frohman,

Rod most recently served as Associate Pastor of Church in Society, Third Presbyterian Church, Rochester, NY for fourteen years. He has a Doctor of Ministry degree from Princeton Theological Seminary (1983), Master of Divinity from Princeton, 1971 and a Bachelor's Degree in American Intellectual History from U.C Berkeley in 1967. He has been a city pastor for 47 years. He is also an Alinsky-trained Industrial Areas Foundation organizer. At Third Presbyterian Church, until he retired on July 1, 2012, Rod directed an outreach ministry composed of 9 teams, 40 programs and approximately 430 volunteers, supported by a two-year core curriculum, "Seeking the Common Good," which he developed. Simultaneous with his work at Third Presbyterian Church, from 2004 to 2012 Rod was the Chair of the Board of Directors, Center for the Congregation in Public Life. Rod is the co-founder and current Board Chair of the Rochester Area Interfaith Hospitality Network, RAIHN.

Now Rod is a mission consultant with congregations in collaboration with Rev. Jim Evinger, another local Presbyterian minister. Rod is a season-ticket holder to the Rochester Red Wings. Rod's wife, Marcia, is a recently retired Manager of One World Goods in Pittsford Plaza. They have two children and two grandchildren. In addition to serving Third Church in Rochester, Rod has been a pastor in Philadelphia, Gary, Indiana and Minneapolis.
