# **Preparation for Worship** (for silent meditation)

The church exists within political communities.

Throughout its history the church has struggled

to be faithful to God in political situations:

under persecution,

or as an established arm of the state,

or in separation from it.

God rules over both political and religious institutions.

We must confuse either with the kingdom of God.

We must not equate the Christian faith

with any nation's way of life

or with opposition to the ideologies of other nations.

We hold Christians are to be law-abiding citizens

unless the state commands them to disobey God,

or claims authority that belongs only to God.

We must not allow governments

to impose Christian faith by legislation,

Nor should we demand undue advantages for the church.

The church must be free to speak to civil authorities,

neither claiming expert knowledge it does not have, nor remaining silent when God's Word is clear.
