Through Christ, with Christ and in Christ, the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor are yours, almighty God, now and forever. Amen.




.....**Socks for the Homeless.**

Why **New** Socks?

Access to shoes and socks is often limited for the homeless men and women living in shelters and on the streets. Common infections such as athlete's foot thrive when damp socks are worn for days or weeks at a time. Frostbite is common in colder months, sometimes resulting in toe amputations. The best way to prevent such conditions is to keep feet clean and dry – very difficult if you spend your days outside.
